The Canadian Scholarship Society has established a scholarship fund to reward Canadian high school students who have achieved academic excellence.

Who is Eligible?

The Canadian Scholarship Society considers candidates who:

1. Are currently in their graduating year from a Canadian high school; or are entering first year full time studies at an accredited Canadian college or university.
2. Canadian citizens or permanent residents (landed immigrants).
3. Maintain a high level of academic achievement.
4. Have demonstrated service and leadership in their communities.
5. Will enroll in specified studies within the Society's criteria.
6. Can demonstrate financial need.
7. Fulfill the application criteria.

Criteria by which candidates are selected:

1. Academic achievement
2. Letters of recommendation
3. Candidate's essay
4. Demonstration of participation in extracurricular/volunteer activity
5. Preference is given to students enrolling in studies in the areas of: science, medical, mathematics, engineering, accounting, commerce and trades.

Candidate's School and Community Reference Instructions:

Select a person within your school who can provide a written reference letter. This person can be a teacher, principal or counselor. Select someone who knows you well. This cannot be a relative or friend. Enclose with application.

Provide a letter of recommendation from a leader within the community. This person can be a volunteer supervisor or someone holding a position of responsibility in the community. Enclose with application.

Academic Transcription and Declaration:

Academic Transcription: Your **full Canadian high school education** must be enclosed with your application. You must submit all transcripts for all high schools attended. Transcripts must have an official school seal/stamp and signature.

Sign the Candidate's Declaration form. If you are under 18 years of age, your parent or legal guardian must also sign the form.

Submitting the Application Package:

Ensure all sections of the application are complete. Submit only one copy of your application. Completed applications must be submitted no later than April 30, of the current year.

Reference letters should describe how the candidate has demonstrated commitment, academic achievement, reliability, good attendance, participation and potential for leadership.

Include the length of time you have known the candidate and in which capacity.
Enclose in an envelope, seal and submit to candidate.

Section G: Candidate's Declaration

I declare that the information in my application is true, complete, and accurate to the best of my knowledge. If I withdraw from full-time status at a Canadian post-secondary institution, I will notify the Canadian Scholarship Society immediately in writing and will reimburse all awards provided to me by this program.

My application is subject to verification. If I am selected as a scholarship recipient and it is determined that I have falsified any aspect of my application or do not meet the requirements I will be held liable to reimburse the Canadian Scholarship Society all awards provided.
